

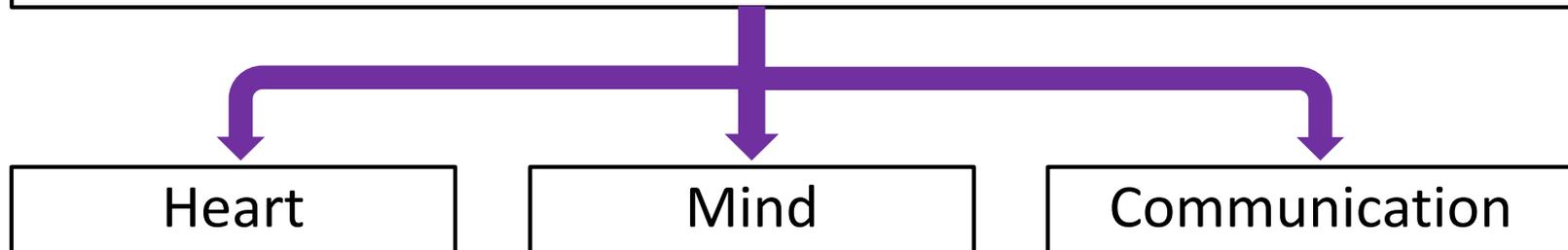

World Marathon Challenge: Britain's Susannah Gill wins after runs in seven continents

British runner Susannah Gill has won the World Marathon Challenge after completing seven marathons across seven continents in seven days.

Gill ran the gruelling 295km (183 miles) in a world record time of 24 hours 19 minutes nine seconds, burning up to 5,000 calories a day.

The 34-year-old ran the final race in Miami on Wednesday night in 3:26:24.

"It was a crazy ambition that I wanted to do. The challenge seemed absolutely irresistible to me," she told the BBC. "Ten years ago, I just wanted to get fit and run the London Marathon. Now, marathon running has literally taken me around the world."
