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

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

SUBJECT CHALLENGE

ENGLISH

In Year 7 you will develop the skills you have learnt in your primary school and build on those in English. Straight away we will be working on the amazing summer read 'Flamingo Boy' by Michael Morpurgo, this means you will already come to Year 7 full of knowledge and ideas about this book. We also study two set texts in Year 7: A Monster Calls by Patrick Ness and The Boy in the Striped Pyjamas; studying full novels gives you a chance to really explore the ideas and themes in them and look at the background information of each era they are set in to support your analysis and understanding.



Not only do we read full novels we also study the history of the English Language and read extracts from authors like Chaucer and Shakespeare to help us understand how language has changed and developed and what great writers of the past were creating for the readers of their times and also today. To build on this knowledge we explore the full play of Romeo & Juliet by William Shakespeare and get to grips with the world and language of Shakespeare. Linked to The Boy in the Striped Pyjamas and the study of World War II we explore the play War Horse by Michael Morpurgo (who you are familiar with from your summer read 'Flamingo Boy').



As you can see you get to explore a lot of different types of literature across the last 1000 years! You will be able to bring your knowledge from Primary school and apply it to your studies seamlessly and enjoy a deep understanding of our English Language and its Literature.
